
## **About the Program**

In 2016, the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management (DFFM) entered into a Master Agreement with the US Forest Service Region 3 authorizing the use of the Good Neighbor Authority (GNA). This program allows state forestry agencies to carry out forest, rangeland, and watershed restoration activities on federal lands within Arizona, an essential component to keeping our forests healthy and productive, with other clean drinking benefits like water. recreational opportunities, safer communities, and critical wildlife habitat.

Pre-sale work began in 2018 to support the Four Forest Restoration Initiative (4FRI). DFFM partnered with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) under GNA in 2018 to support efforts to reduce community wildfire risk. A dedicated GNA Program was established in 2023 and was expanded to a staff of three by June 2024. DFFM has active agreements with four of the six national forests (Coconino, Tonto, Kaibab, and Apache-Sitgreaves) and is executing its third BLM agreement. In total, more than 10,000 acres have been treated and more than 40,000 timber sale acres marked on federal land.






#### **Four Forest Restoration Initiative (4FRI)**

4FRI includes four National Forests: Coconino, Tonto, Kaibab, and Apache-Sitgreaves (A-S). Identified in 2022 as an Initial Wildfire Crisis Strategy Landscape, 4FRI is a collaborative, landscape-scale initiative designed to restore fire-adapted ecosystems in Arizona. DFFM is a proud partner in this effort.


